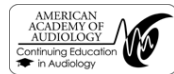

- 4) Draft a consent order and agreement based on an audiologist's or SLP's violation of the law, rules and/or code of ethics.
- 5) Engage in the process utilized in examining ethics violations as well as in reporting to the National Practitioner Data Bank (NPDB).

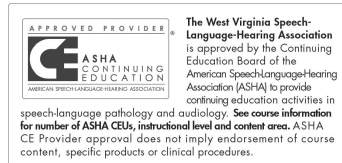
Friday & Saturday Learning Outcomes: Participants will be able to:

- 2) Attendees will have a working knowledge of the primary groups behind the deregulation agenda and the policies they are advancing.

- 4) Describe an overview of the development Physical Therapy Licensure Compact (PTLC) as an enhancement of public protection.
- 5) Understand North Carolina's experience during implementation of the PTLC – Discuss implementation challenges and successes.
- 6) Attendees will learn about occupational licensure compacts and how states and professions are using them to achieve professional licensure portability and reciprocity while maintaining state sovereignty and strong consumer protections.
- 7) Attendees will specifically learn about the occupational licensure compact for audiologists and speech pathologists.
- 8) Discuss the goals of the NPDB and its merger with the HIPDB.
- 9) Describe the procedure by which the NPDB receives information from state regulatory boards.
- 10) Examine the postings for SLPs and AUDs within the data bank with emphasis on most commonly reported violations.
- 11) Highlight state legislative and regulatory actions related to audiology.
- 12) Identify challenges and opportunities for state Academies related to audiology.
- 13) Compare rules and regulations across states.
